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Introduction

Tribology, the science and technology of interacting surfaces in relative motion, has been established worldwide as a major enabler for progress of industrialised economies. Realising the far-reaching influence of this subject, Tribology Society of India (TSI) was formed in the year 1989. As a premier professional society, the TSI has a vision to spread awareness and practice of Tribology all across India. To fulfil this mission, the Society has been organising International Conference on Industrial Tribology (ICIT) biennially in different regions of the country. The 7th ICIT is being organised in the eastern part of India, in the nature's adorable city of Ranchi, during December 2-4, 2010.

The mineral rich eastern India is the hub of a large network of steel, mining and al industries. These industries are working under tremendous load of heat, dust and severity. These conditions pose big challenge to Tribology. There is need to develop and apply advanced tribological concepts for improving equipment reliability, reducing energy consumption, and providing healthy working environment to the operating personnel and other habitants. Theme of the ICIT 2010 has therefore been chosen as "Tribology for Steel and Mining Industries".

About the Organiser

ICIT 2010 shall be organised by R&D Centre for Iron and Steel (RDCIS) in its beautiful premises at Ranchi. RDCIS is the corporate R&D Centre of Steel Authority of India Ltd. (SAIL), the largest steel producer in India. It employs more than 250 scientists and engineers and is a premier research organisation in the field of ferrous metallurgy. The Centre is equipped with state-of-the-art diagnostic and testing facilities including pilot scale laboratories. The major efforts of RDCIS are directed towards process innovations, product development, cost reduction, quality improvement in different SAIL plants. The Centre pursues a number of collaborative research programmes with leading institutions in India and abroad. Education Course
